





What you drink has a significant impact on your blood vessels and overall health. The poorer the condition of your blood vessels, the higher your risk for stroke. Recent studies have provided new insights into how different drinks affect blood vessel health and how we choose healthy drinks.

One study examined the effects of drinking soft drinks and fruit juices on stroke risk.

Researchers found that consuming just one soft drink per day was associated with a 22% increase in overall stroke risk. Interestingly, this study found that drinking one processed fruit juice daily was linked to an even higher increased risk of 37%. The study also noted that while fruit juices can contain nutrients good for blood vessels, many of them also have added sweeteners and preservatives that can cause the fruit juices to lose their positive effects. Nevertheless, drinking seven or more glasses of water daily was linked to a reduced risk of stroke, showing that water is a healthier choice than sugary drinks such as soft drinks and fruit juices.

Another study investigated the impact of coffee and tea consumption on stroke risk. Results of the study showed that drinking more than four cups of coffee daily was associated with a 37% increase in stroke risk, although moderate coffee intake did not appear to raise this risk. In contrast, drinking more than four cups of tea daily was linked to an average 19% decrease in stroke risk. Black and green tea were found to be particularly helpful, associated with a 29% and 27% reduction in stroke risk, respectively.

Taiwan has introduced new regulations to stop live shows featuring wild animals like dolphins, tigers, and other wild mammals. The Ministry of Agriculture (MOA) announced these changes in July 2024, banning the use of wild animals for entertainment or close interactions with visitors. The new laws came after a 2022 case involving Leofoo Village Theme Park, where visitors were allowed to feed lions and tigers, raising animal safety concerns. Animal rights groups support the new regulations but believe more clarity is needed, especially for marine mammals. Under the new rules, businesses that keep wild animals must show how they care for and display the wild animals.

Taiwan joins 13 other countries, including Switzerland, Hungary, Costa Rica, and India, that have banned captive animal performances. In Canada and France, laws strictly ban dolphin and whale shows. Additionally, all 30 places in the United Kingdom that kept dolphins and whales had closed by 1993. South Korea has stopped tourists from interacting with dolphins, but they still hold dolphin performances. However, places like Farglory Ocean Park in Hualien and Yehliu Ocean World in New Taipei still host dolphin shows. Although their permits for holding wild animal shows will expire in 2026, it is uncertain if the ocean park companies will apply for a new permit. In the future, zoos and aquariums in Taiwan that wish to continue their
